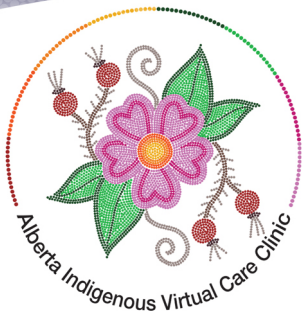

Solid Waste Site Remediation

Old waste storage sites and unlined landfills represent a significant risk to the environment and human health as well being an unpleasant nuisance. These types of sites are still relatively common in Alberta's First Nations, but waste removal and remediation efforts are underway with funding from the First Nations Solid Waste Management Initiative. The construction of improved waste management facilities to transfer waste Off-Reserve to regional landfills has ended the reliance on these old waste storage sites for many of Alberta's First Nations. Through this years ACRS inspections, we have been able to see the result of some of these remediation projects and the improvement compared to previous years. We want to extend a huge congratulations to the First Nations who have completed landfill remediation projects and can now utilize those spaces for other purposes!
